

## What is SNAP/EBT?

SNAP and EBT defined

**SNAP - Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program** 

SNAP "is the nation's most important anti-hunger program."

#### EBT - Electronic Benefits Transfer

EBT "is an electronic system that allows a recipient to authorize transfer of their government benefits from a federal account to a retailer account to pay for products received."

SNAP Eligibility Guidelines: Staple Foods

#### Staple Foods

"the basic foods that make up a significant portion of a person's diet.

They are usually prepared at home and eaten as a meal."

vegetables or fruits

dairy products

breads or cereals

meat poultry fish

SNAP Eligibility Guidelines: Criterion A

#### **Criterion A**

"A store must have 3 stocking units of 3 different varieties for each staple food category on a continuous basis. For 2 staple food categories, there must be at least 1 perishable variety. Most stores are authorized under Criterion A."

vegetables or fruits

3 of 3 items

dairy products

3 of 3 items

3 of 3 items

breads

or

cereals

+ 1 perishable variety in 2 categories

meat poultry fish

3 of 3 items

## What Would This Look Like for Me?

A C-Store Friendly Example



#### Criterion A

"A store must have 3 stocking units of 3 different varieties for each staple food category on a continuous basis. For 2 staple food categories, there must be at least 1 perishable variety. Most stores are authorized under Criterion A."

3 x 100% orange juice

3 x 100% apple juice

3 x fresh bananas (perishable)

3 of 3 items

3 x milk (perishable)

3 x yogurt (perishable)

3 x formula (perishable)

3 of 3 items

3 x loaf bread (perishable) 3 x pasta

3 x bagels

(perishable)

3 of 3 items

3 x beef jerky

3 x canned tuna fish

3 x fresh/liquid eggs (perishable)

3 of 3 items

+ 1 perishable variety in at least 2 categories

SNAP Eligibility Guidelines: Criterion B

Most convenience stores do not fit into this model.

#### **Criterion B**

"A store must have more than **50%** of its total gross retail sales from the sale of staple foods. Specialty stores, like butcher shops, are often authorized under Criterion B."

Other Eligibility Considerations

FNS also takes other factors into account when determining the eligibility of your store.

## Is This Right for My Store?

### Tips for C-Stores

You must be able to keep 3 of 3 varieties in each of the four categories on a continual basis. That is a total of **36 items** on a daily basis. Do you have the space to stock these items? Do you already offer similar items that qualify (i.e. milk, 100% fruit juices, jerky, bread/cereal)? Review the staple foods as outlined by the USDA.

- Increased sales of other items due to traffic for SNAP

#### Staple Foods Overview

Retail food stores must meet <u>Criterion A</u> or <u>Criterion B</u> staple food requirements.

Staple food varieties\* are different types of food within a staple food category. Included below are lists of acceptable staple food varieties in the four staple food categories, which can be used to determine whether or not a food item is a staple food for purposes of SNAP
